"To start I would like to say something about (Oklahoma State) Coach (James) Wadley's great career. He has been there 40 years. I think he started being the coach there when I was in first grade, and I feel like I have been doing this a long time. He probably doesn't get the credit he deserves for what he accomplished at Oklahoma State. I think he will be missed in college tennis. He is truly one of the good characters in our sport."

"We felt like we played pretty well at No. 2 and 3 doubles. It was great to get off quick. We didn't do a good job when we played them a couple weeks ago in Stillwater. The scores were pretty similar in doubles and then they won three of the first set in singles. We were kind of lucky to win that match. Today we really wanted to emphasize to come out and get off to a good start in singles and we didn't lose a set in singles so I am pretty please with that."

James Wadley, Oklahoma State Head Coach

"We played a little better at home, but they came back and we added another player that had been out which makes a lot of difference in the lineup. They're a quality team and we're just a little shorthanded. They played well in the end and a little bit better than we did. Last time we scared them just a little bit, not a lot but this time they were just too strong."
