Todd Petty, Texas Tech Head Coach

"Credit Missouri, we didn't play our best tennis, but that was a lot because of Missouri, not because of us. My hat's off to them. They competed really hard. I was proud to get through that and am looking forward to tomorrow. It was good everybody got pushed today. I think that is going to help us as the tournament progresses. It is going to take more of a team effort tomorrow. We are going to have to show up in the top three positions earlier. That doesn't mean we have to win them, but we are going to have to be in the match. I felt like we put a lot of pressure on our No. 4, 5 and 6 today, because we gave them so many leads at No. 1, 2 and 3. I don't think we can do that tomorrow."

"I have a lot of respect for Texas Tech. I think they are a great program. They have had a great year. I was proud of the way we battled today. The wind was a tough challenge, but I thought we played really well in doubles and were really in some battles in singles. They were just better than us today.
