Game Notes: No. 4 Kansas State 74, No. 5 Iowa State 67

Big 12 Championship Notes

- This was the 10<sup>th</sup> meeting between Kansas State and Iowa State at the Big 12 Championship with the Wildcats now holding a 8-2 advantage in the series. The last meeting at the tournament was in 2012 when No. 5 Kansas State beat No. 4 seed Iowa State, 67-63.
- This is the third time overall, and first time since 2011, that K-State has been the No. 4 seed. The Wildcats won the previous two games as the No. 4, beating No. 5 Iowa State, 56-53 in 2011, and No. 5 seed Texas, 79-63 in 2002.
- This is the first time since 2012 that K-State will advance to the semifinals in the Big 12 Championship.
- K-State Coach Jeff Mittie is 3-4 all time at the Big 12 Championship, 2-2 at the helm of the Wildcats. This will be the first time K-State will have advanced to the semifinals under Coach Mittie.

Individual & Team Notes

- The Wildcats had a season-high 45 points from their bench, besting 39 bench points by K-State in a win against ISU earlier in this season.
- K-State sophomore Kayla Goth was the top scorer in the game with 25 points, which was a career high and the most points she has scored against a Big 12 opponent to date.
- Freshman Eternati Willock recorded 12 points and 10 rebounds, tabbing just her second career double-double. Senior Kindred Wesemann tabbed 12 points with six assists, tying a season-high.
- ISU junior Emily Durr led the Cyclones with a season-high 21 points. With 12 points, senior Seanna Johnson has netted double figures in 25 games on the season and in 88 games during her career.
- Iowa State held the Wildcats to just seven points in the opening quarter, an all-time low in a Big 12 Championship game.
