No. 3 Kansas 65, No. 6 Texas 57

Big 12 Championship Notes

- This is the fifth meeting between Texas and Kansas in Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship play. KU holds a 5-1 edge in the series.
- Kansas is making their 23rd trip to the Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship, their third as the No. 3 seed. The Jayhawks have an overall record of 45-11 in championship play and a 20-3 mark in the quarterfinals. As the 3 seed, KU is 5-1, with their only loss a 60-64 setback against Texas on March 13, 2004.
- This is also the 23rd appearance in Big 12 Men's Basketball Championship play for Texas. The Longhorns have a 26-23 record in championship play and are 13-9 in quarterfinal action. Texas has a 2-4 record as the No. 6 seed.
- The Longhorns fail to advance to the semifinals for the fifth-consecutive year.

Individual & Team Notes

- Kansas had a six-minute stretch in the second half where they didn't record a field goal make, but Texas was only able to score nine points during that run, shooting 3-of-9 from the floor and 1-of-2 from the line. The Longhorns also went 0-for-6 down the stretch after a three-pointer by Kerwin Roach II with 2:43 to go.
- The top three scorers on the year for Texas (Kerwin Roach II-8, Jaxson Hayes-2 and Matt Coleman III-3) were held to a combined 13 points after averaging 45.5 pts/gm.
- Texas senior Dylan Osetkowski recorded a season-high 18 points. Previous best was 16 vs. Kansas on Jan 29, 2019.
- Kansas freshman Devon Dotson (381) scored 17 points to pass J.R. Giddens (374) and Mario Chalmers (379) for 10th most points by a Jayhawk freshman in a season. He also moved into eighth on the assists list with 113 past Sherron Collins (112) and into sixth in minutes played with 1,040 on the year. His team-high 37 on the night pushed him in front of Aaron Miles (1,017) and Wayne Seldon, Jr. (1,022).
- Dotson led the Jayhawks in scoring for the fourth time this season with 17 and dished out a team-high four assists. Tonight was the fourth time he's led Kansas in both categories on the year.
- Freshman David McCormack set career highs in rebounds (nine) and minutes (29). He scored in double figures for the third straight game and fifth time on the year. He also led the Jayhawks on the glass for the first time this year.
- Junior Dedric Lawson recorded his 20th-straight game in double figures. He has scored in double-digits in all but two games on the year for Kansas, posting 16 points tonight.
