## QUICK NOTES

- **The Big 12 has a 29-1 record so far this season. Eleven of 12 teams boast undefeated records.**
- **Playing Defense:** Big 12 teams have held 26 of 30 opponents this year to 70 points or less. Fourteen of those foes have been at 60 points or less.
- **The Big 12 has four schools ranked in the latest ESPNU Top 25 men's basketball recruiting rankings for the Class of 2010 - No. 13 Missouri, No. 14 Oklahoma, No. 20 Texas A&M and No. 25 Baylor.**
- ESPN The Magazine had EIGHT teams from the Big 12 ranked among the top 50 in the nation in its preseason poll. The three top 10 teams (KU, UT, OU) in the magazine's tally are more than any conference in the country.
- **The Big 12 was rated as the best conference in the nation for 2009-10 by CBSSports.com, ESPN The Magazine and FoxSports.com.**
- The Big 12 will play the 5,000th game in its men's basketball history this season when Baylor faces Alabama on Nov. 26 in the Old Spice Classic.
- **Fourteen of the 16 members of last year's Academic All-Big 12 Teams will take the court again this season.**
- Seven of the 10 members of last year's All-Big 12 First and Second Teams are back in 2009-10. Five of seven Big 12 major award winners are suiting up again this season.
- **Three Big 12 players who earned some form of All-America honors a year ago return in '09-10. Four of the top five scorers and 12 of the top 15 assist leaders are also back.**
- **The Big 12 has the nation's best winning percentage in NCAA competition over the last two years and during the last seven seasons (since 2003).**
- Since 2002, the Big 12 has had more NCAA regional finalists than any other conference and DOUBLE the amount of all but one league.
- **The Big 12 has had five different players named Consensus All-America over the last three years. The total is at least two more than any conference.**



**BAYLOR (3-0, 0-0 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Hardin-Simmons (Nov. 22)

**Recent Result:** Defeated Southern, 61-45

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-0/3-0

- Junior guard LaceDarius Dunn has 74 points in three outings, the most total points so far in the Big 12. He reached double digits for the third straight game with a team-high 13 points versus Southern.
- Junior forward Ekpe Udoh has posted double-figure scoring totals in three straight outings for the first time in his career. He had 11 points against Southern and has 10 blocks in his first three contests at BU.
- Dunn moved into 16th place on Baylor's career scoring list with 1,109 points. He has made at least one 3-pointer in 15 consecutive games dating back to last season.
- Baylor has won 13 of its last 14 non-conference home games. The Bears are 22-5 in November under head coach Scott Drew and have an all-time record of 34-0 versus SWAC opponents.



**COLORADO (3-0, 0-0 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Gonzaga (Nov. 23)

**Recent Result:** Beat Texas Southern, 88-77

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-0/3-0

- Colorado has scored at least 80 points in each of its first three games. Last year, the Buffaloes only reached the 80-point mark twice during the entire season.
- Junior guard Cory Higgins tallied his 15th career 20-point scoring effort with 23 points versus Texas Southern. He has 874 career points and is 21-of-30 (.700) from the field in 2009-10.
- Freshman guard Alec Burks has scored in double digits in each of his first three outings after tying Higgins with a game-high 23 points against Texas Southern. Burks is shooting 60.9 percent.
- Colorado is 3-0 for the first time since the 2001-02 season. The last time the Buffs began a campaign with a 4-0 record was 1998-99.



**IOWA STATE (3-0, 0-0 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Mississippi Valley State (Nov. 22)

**Recent Result:** Won at Drake, 90-70

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-0/3-0

- Junior guard Lucca Staiger had a career-high 32 points in the win at Drake. He was 10-of-16 from 3-point range, setting an ISU record for 3-pointers and helping the Cyclones connect on 14 for the game.
- Staiger's 10 field goals from beyond the arc tied for the second-most in Big 12 history (Al Coleman, UT vs. KSU, 1-12-97). Staiger has 15 field goals from 3-point range this season, the most in the Big 12.
- Junior forward Craig Brackins recorded his first double-double of the year and the 19th of his career with 22 points and 10 boards at Drake. He was scoreless for the first 12 minutes of the contest.
- Junior forward LaRon Dendy will miss at least four games after spraining his knee in practice. He had 16 points and seven rebounds in the opener against Idaho State.



**KANSAS (3-0, 0-0 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Oakland (Nov. 25)

**Recent Result:** Beat Central Arkansas, 94-44

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-0/3-0

- Four players - Sherron Collins, Xavier Henry, Marcus Morris and Tyrel Reed - led Kansas with 12 points each in the win over Central Arkansas. A total of 11 players scored against UCA.
- The Jayhawks 50-point victory was their largest margin since defeating Dartmouth by 51 points (83-32) on Nov. 28, 2007. KU has led the Big 12 in scoring margin seven times in league history.
- Junior center Cole Aldrich has had at least three blocked shots in every game this season. He has 140 rejections in his career, ninth on the all-time Kansas list.
- Freshman Xavier Henry has scored in double digits in each of his first three contests. He is averaging 16.7 points, the second-best total among freshmen in the Big 12 Conference.



**KANSAS STATE (3-0, 0-0 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Mississippi (Nov. 20)

**Recent Result:** Topped Boston University, 80-70

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-0/3-0

- Freshman guard Rodney McGruder led five players in double figures with a career-high 20 points versus Boston University. He finished 5-of-6 from the field and grabbed five rebounds in 22 minutes.
- Sophomore forward Jamar Samuels is averaging 13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds after posting just 8.3 points and 4.7 boards per game a year ago. He is 13-of-22 (.591) from the field.
- Kansas State has had at least five players in double digits in the scoring column in every game. Five Wildcats are averaging at least 10.0 points, while the team ranks third in the Big 12 with 84.7 points per game.
- Junior guard Jacob Pullen has scored in double digits in 42 career games. He has 10 points or more in eight of nine contests dating back to last season.



**MISSOURI (1-0, 0-0 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. UT-Pan American (Nov. 22)

**Recent Result:** Beat Tennessee-Martin, 83-68

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 1-0/1-0

- Sophomore forward Laurence Bowers tied his career-high with 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting against UT-Martin, his fourth career double-figure scoring effort. He also had eight rebounds and four blocks.
- Senior forward Keith Ramsey added 15 points versus the Skyhawks on 7-of-11 shooting with seven rebounds. It was his third game in double digits in the last two years.
- Missouri has won 20 consecutive games at home over the past three seasons. The Tigers are 31-0 at home versus non-conference opponents and 4-0 in home openers under coach Mike Anderson.
- Including its two exhibition games, MU has won its three contests this season by an average of 33.7 points. At least three players have been in double-figures in each contest.

**NEBRASKA (1-1, 0-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** vs. TCU (Nov. 21)**Recent Result:** Lost at Saint Louis, 69-55**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 1-1/1-1

- Senior guard Sek Henry was the leading scorer against Saint Louis with 14 points. He has 14 double-figure scoring outputs over the last two seasons, including two of his last three games.
- Nebraska has held 13 of its last 15 and 29 of its past 33 opponents to 70 points or less. During that span, 15 foes have been held below the 60-point mark.
- Senior guard Ryan Anderson had a career-best six steals versus USC-Upstate, the highest total for a NU player since 2001. He needs just seven thefts to move into the top 10 of the all-time school list.
- The Huskers returned only four scholarship players from last year as freshmen Jorge Brian Diaz and Brandon Ubel have started the first two outings. Ubel is the third-youngest player in the Big 12.

**OKLAHOMA (2-0, 0-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** at VCU (Nov. 21)**Recent Result:** Beat UL-Monroe, 72-61**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-0/2-0

- Sophomore guard Willie Warren finished with a game-high 24 points versus UL-Monroe. He has 39 points in the Sooners' first two games, with 15 assists.
- Freshman forward Tiny Gallon has posted double-digit rebound totals in each of his first two outings. He grabbed 10 boards against ULM and has 25 in two contests this season.
- Oklahoma picked up its 1,500th win in program history with the victory over ULM. The win also marked the 150th in the career of head coach Jeff Capel.
- The Sooners have won 14 straight home non-conference games and 72 of their last 74 matchups in Norman.

**OKLAHOMA STATE (2-0, 0-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** vs. North Texas (Nov. 21)**Recent Result:** Defeated Southern, 93-61**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-0/2-0

- Junior guard James Anderson recorded the fifth 30-point game of his career with 30 points and 10 rebounds against Southern. The five 30-point performances are the most of any active Big 12 player.
- Anderson has scored in double digits in 16 consecutive outings dating back to last season. He has had 20 points or more nine times during that span, including 30 or more on four occasions.
- Six players posted double-digit point totals against Southern. Junior forward Marshall Moses had his ninth career double-double with 14 points and 13 boards.
- The Cowboys have won their opening game in each of the last 15 seasons and 20 of the last 21 campaigns.

**TEXAS (2-0, 0-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** vs. Iowa (Nov. 23)**Recent Result:** Beat Western Carolina, 73-41**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-0/2-0

- Senior Damion James led the Longhorns with 18 points against Western Carolina. It was his second double-digit point total of the season and 71st time in his career he has reached the plateau.
- Texas has started 2-0 for the seventh consecutive season and 10th time in 12 years under Head Coach Rick Barnes. UT is 63-5 at the Erwin Center in the last five campaigns (dating back to 2005-06).
- Freshman guard J'Covan Brown reached double-figures for the second time in his career with 10 points on 3-of-3 shooting versus Western Carolina. He also had three assists and three rebounds.
- The Longhorns have held their opponents to under 25 points in all four halves through the first two games. Texas foes are shooting 17.3 percent (5-of-29) from 3-point range.

**TEXAS A&M (2-0, 0-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** Samford (Nov. 20)**Recent Result:** Won at SMU, 80-68**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-0/2-0

- Senior guard Donald Sloan finished with a career-high 24 points at SMU, including 16 in the first half. He also had four assists, as the Aggies improved to 41-8 when he dishes out at least three assists.
- Senior Derek Roland added 21 points versus the Mustangs, including 8-of-8 from the free throw line. Texas A&M is 13-2 in his career when he scores in double figures.
- Head coach Mark Turgeon won his 50th game at Texas A&M with the victory over Angelo State. He is 51-21 (.708) in his third season in College Station, including 17-1 in contests played in November.
- The Aggies are 18-2 under Turgeon when scoring at least 80 points and have posted a 48-9 mark when scoring at least 60. In three seasons, A&M is 40-5 under Turgeon when leading at halftime.

**TEXAS TECH (4-0, 0-0 Big 12)****Next Game:** vs. Lamar (Nov. 21)**Recent Result:** Beat Northwestern State, 94-75**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 4-0/4-0

- Junior guard Mike Singletary had a game-high 25 points on 8-of-11 shooting versus Northwestern State. It was his seventh career 20-point effort and fourth straight double-digit scoring output this season.
- Singletary has connected on 22-of-23 (.957) from the free line in 2009-10. The percentage leads all Big 12 players among those with more than 10 attempts.
- Sophomore guard John Roberson has recorded 110 assists over his last 17 contests, including nine or more four times. He has 16 assists and six steals in his first three outings.
- Texas Tech has posted back-to-back 4-0 starts for the first time since the 2002-03 and 2003-04 campaigns. The Northwestern State game marked the 10th anniversary of the opening of United Spirit Arena.
