## BIG 12 NOTES

- The Big 12 has seven teams in the top 38 of the latest RPI. The total is the most of any conference. The Big 12 is ranked as the No. 1 conference in both the RPI and Sagarin Ratings.

### Against Each Other ....

The Big 12 has the best record in the nation amongst the six major conferences when playing each other (through March 14).

- The Big 12 is 142-31 (.821) in non-conference play in 2009-10, including 8-6 versus Associated Press top 25 opponents. The .821 winning percentage is the best in the nation.
- **The Big 12 has seven teams with 21 wins or more - the most of any conference in the nation. The Big 12 was the first league this season to have every team post a double-digit victory total.**
- The Big 12 is 169-35 (.828) at home this season, the best home record of any conference in the nation. In non-conference play, the league is 106-1. The best overall Big 12 home record prior to this year was in 2002-03 (152-36, .809) - a campaign that saw two league squads reach the Final Four.
- **The Big 12 has seven teams with winning percentages of .700 or better, the most of any conference. Nine squads have records at .500 or better.**
- The 141 non-conference wins by the Big 12 is a league record for the most in regular-season play. The non-conference winning percentage (.821) would also be a Big 12 record.
- **At least four league teams have been ranked in the top 25 each of the past 13 weeks. Seven different conference squads have been in the top 25 at some point this year - the most in one season in Big 12 history.**
- The Big 12 has a .500 or better record against 27 of the 29 conferences it has faced in non-league play this season.



**BAYLOR (24-6, 11-5 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Texas or Iowa State (March 11)

**Recent Result:** Defeated Texas, 92-77

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 4-1/8-2

- Baylor finished the regular season with 10 conference wins for the first time in Big 12 history. It also marks the first year the Bears have received a bye in the Big 12 Championship.
- BU swept the season series with Texas for the first time since 1997-98. The Bears swept three conference regular-season series (OU, UT, TTU) for the first time in the Big 12 era.
- Senior guard Tweety Carter has dished out eight or more assists on nine occasions this year. He has 164 assists in 2009-10, sixth on the school single-season chart.
- Junior Ekpe Udoh established Big 12 season records for blocked shots in all games (123) and league contests only (57). He has multiple rejections in 26 of 30 outings this season.



**COLORADO (15-15, 6-10 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Texas Tech (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Beat Texas Tech, 101-90

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/4-6

- Colorado won three straight games to end the regular season for the first time since 2002-03. The Buffaloes' 15 overall victories and six Big 12 wins are the most since 2005-06 (20-10, 9-7).
- The Buffs' 101 points against Texas Tech were their most since Feb. 19, 2000 (102-90 win over Iowa State). CU has scored 70 points in 20 of 30 games this year, posting a 14-6 record in those contests.
- Freshman guard Alec Burks set the Colorado freshman scoring record this year with 488 points. The total was the ninth-best in Big 12 history and his 16.8 points per game led all league freshmen in 2009-10.
- Junior guard Cory Higgins has scored 30 points or more three times this season and five times in his career. He has 1,373 career points, a total that ranks ninth on the school's all-time scoring list.



**IOWA STATE (15-16, 4-12 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Texas (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Defeated Kansas State, 85-82 (ot)

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 2-3/2-8

- Iowa State ended a 21-game losing streak to ranked opponents with the win over Kansas State. It was the Cyclones' first victory over a nationally-ranked foe since Feb. 5, 2006 (No. 25 Colorado, 96-79).
- Senior forward Marquis Gilstrap was the lone Big 12 player this year to average a double-double in conference play (15.3 points, 10.3 rebounds). He had 10 or more boards in 13 outings.
- Junior forward Craig Brackins has 31 double-doubles in his career, tied for fifth on the all-time school list. He has recorded a double-double in three of his last four outings.
- Junior guard Diante Garrett has had five or more assists in a game 18 times in 2009-10. He finished the regular-season with 156 assists, the third-best total in the Big 12.



**KANSAS (29-2, 15-1 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Colorado or Texas Tech (March 11)

**Recent Result:** Won at Missouri, 77-56

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 4-1/9-1

- KU has won at least 15 league games four times since the Big 12 began play (1996-97). The Jayhawks have won or shared 10 regular-season Big 12 titles, earning the No. 1 seed in the Big 12 Championship six times.
- Senior guard Sherron Collins has 1,803 points in his career, 14th on the all-time Big 12 scoring list. He has scored in double digits in 10 of his last 11 outings, including 15 points or more on seven occasions.
- Kansas needs one victory to become just the third program in college basketball history (Kentucky, North Carolina) to reach the 2,000-win plateau. KU is 1,999-795 (.715) all-time.
- Junior center Cole Aldrich has 110 blocks in 2009-10, third on the Big 12 single-season list. He has had multiple rejections in 28 of 31 contests, with 13 double-doubles on the year.



**KANSAS STATE (24-6, 11-5 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Oklahoma or Oklahoma State (March 11)

**Recent Result:** Lost to Iowa State, 85-82 (ot)

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/7-3

- K-State earned the No. 2 seed in the Big 12 Championship, its highest in the Big 12 era. The Cats have been fourth or higher in each of the last four years after never having been higher than No. 7 in their history.
- Kansas State has recorded its most overall (24) and conference victories (11) since the 1987-88 season. The Wildcats have won at least 21 games each of the past four years.
- Junior forward Curtis Kelly has 56 blocks this season, the second-best total in school history. He needs four more rejections to set a single-season KSU record.
- The Wildcats lead the Big 12 in free throws made with 624 on the season. The total establishes a school record, topping the mark set during the 1958-59 campaign (606).



**MISSOURI (22-9, 10-6 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Nebraska (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Lost to Kansas, 77-56

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/6-4

- MU has a 22-10 record in Big 12 play over the last two years, the second-highest win total in the league during that span. The Tigers have had back-to-back 10-win campaigns for the first time since 1999-2000.
- Mizzou caused 19 turnovers and grabbed nine steals in the loss to Kansas. The Tigers continue to lead the nation with 11.1 steals per game and have 729 steals the last two seasons, a Big 12 two-year record.
- Ten of the 13 athletes on the Missouri roster play at least 10.0 minutes per game, with no one averaging more than 26.7 minutes. Eight different players have led the team in scoring in 2009-10.
- Sophomore guard Marcus Denmon leads the Tigers with 13.6 points per game over the last five outings, despite coming off the bench each contest. He has made 10 shots from 3-point range during that time.



**NEBRASKA (14-17, 2-14 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Missouri (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Lost at Oklahoma State, 74-55

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 1-4/1-9

- Nebraska has met Missouri five times in the Big 12 Championship, more than any other opponent. The Cornhuskers have won the last two postseason matchups with the Tigers.
- Sophomore guard Brandon Richardson led NU with 16 points on 5-of-7 shooting at Oklahoma State. He has scored 15 points or more in two of his last three outings.
- Freshman forward Christian Standhardinger has scored in double digits in three of his past four contests. Since becoming eligible on Jan. 9, he has reached the double-figure scoring plateau five times.
- Redshirt freshman Jorge Brian Diaz has tied the Nebraska freshman blocked shots record (39). He has also scored in double digits in two of his last four contests.



**OKLAHOMA (13-17, 4-12 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Oklahoma State (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Lost to Texas A&M, 69-54

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 0-5/1-9

- Oklahoma and Oklahoma State will meet in the Big 12 Championship for the second straight season. Prior to the last two years, the two teams had met once (1999) in the entire history of the event.
- Freshman guard Tommy Mason-Griffin has set OU freshman records for assists (145) and 3-point field goals made (69). The assist total is fourth on the Big 12 single-season freshman chart.
- Mason-Griffin has led the Sooners in scoring nine of his last 13 outings. He has scored in double digits in six of the last seven contests and totaled 40 assists during that span.
- Freshman Andrew Fitzgerald has notched double-figure point totals three times in the last five outings. Prior to the current string, he had recorded three double-figure efforts the entire season.



**OKLAHOMA STATE (21-9, 9-7 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Oklahoma (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Defeated Nebraska, 74-55

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/5-5

- Junior guard James Anderson has scored 25 points or more 17 times this season and has reached double digits in 43 consecutive games overall. He is averaging 26.3 points in his last three contests.
- Anderson needs three points to move into fifth place on the OSU single-season scoring list. He has 838 career points in Big 12 games, the most by a Cowboy in league history.
- Sophomore guard Keiton Page has made 23 consecutive free throws and 39 of his last 40 (.975) from the line. He has scored in double digits five times in the past eight outings, with 31 assists.
- Junior forward Matt Pilgrim has grabbed 10 or more rebounds four times in the last eight games. He has also shot 50.0 percent or better from the field in 12 of the past 13 contests.



**TEXAS (23-8, 9-7 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Iowa State (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Lost at Baylor, 92-77

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 3-2/5-5

- Junior forward Gary Johnson had a career-high 25 points with eight rebounds at Baylor. It was his third career 20-point effort and the seventh time in 10 games he has grabbed at least eight boards.
- Senior Damion James has tied the Big 12 record (Aaron Miles, KU) for career games started with 137. He has played in a UT-record 139 career contests overall, a total that is fifth on the all-time conference list.
- Freshman Jordan Hamilton is averaging 13.7 points over his last seven outings, posting double figures in six of seven. He has also shot 50 percent or better in five of the past seven contests.
- Texas has reached the 20-win plateau in each of its last 11 seasons and in all but one year under coach Rick Barnes. The 250 victories in the past 10 years is the second-most in a 10-year period in school history.



**TEXAS A&M (22-8, 11-5 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Missouri or Nebraska (March 11)

**Recent Result:** Won at Oklahoma, 69-54

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 4-1/8-2

- Texas A&M has earned a first-round bye in the Big 12 Championship for the third time in the last five years. Prior to the current stretch, the Aggies had never been seeded higher than seventh.
- Senior guard Donald Sloan has scored in double digits in 14 consecutive games. He has scored 20 points or more nine times this season and led the Aggies in scoring on 18 occasions.
- A&M led the Big 12 in scoring defense in conference games, allowing just 65.8 points per contest. It marked the first time in league history the Aggies have led the Big 12 in the category.
- The Aggies have recorded at least 20 wins each of the last six seasons. Prior to the current string, Texas A&M had six years with 20 victories or more in its entire history.



**TEXAS TECH (16-14, 4-12 Big 12)**

**Next Game:** vs. Colorado (March 10)

**Recent Result:** Lost at Colorado, 101-90

**Last 5/Last 10 Games:** 0-5/2-8

- Senior guard Nick Okorie had a career-high 34 points in the regular season finale at Colorado. He has scored 101 points in his last five outings (20.2 ppg), shooting 55.9 percent (33-of-59) from the floor.
- Junior forward Mike Singletary has had nine 20-point performances this year, including each of the last two contests. He has also had six games with 10 or more boards, including two of the past three.
- Junior guard John Roberson is the Red Raiders' career leader with 474 assists, just 13 away from the top 10 of the Big 12 all-time chart. He has had five or more assists in a game 17 times this season.
- Texas Tech has met Colorado twice in Big 12 Championship history, with the Red Raiders winning both matchups. Tech has an unbeaten record against three teams (BU, TAMU) in the event.
