BIG 12 NOTES

- The Big 12 has seven teams in the top 40 and eight in the top 50 of the latest RPI - both totals are the most of any conference in the nation. The Big 12 is ranked No. 1 in the RPI among all conferences.

Against Each Other

The Big 12 has the best record in the nation amongst the six major conferences when playing each other (through February 8).

- The Big 12 is 142-31 (.821) in non-conference play in 2009-10, including 8-6 versus Associated Press top 25 opponents. The .821 winning percentage is the best in the nation.
- **The Big 12 has six teams with 17 victories or more and seven with 16 wins or higher. Both totals tie for the most of any conference. The Big 12 was the first conference this season to have every team post a double-digit victory total.**
- The Big 12 is 141-18 (.887) at home this season, the best home record of any conference in the nation. In non-conference play, the league is 106-1. The best overall Big 12 home record prior to this year was in 2002-03 (152-36, .809) - a campaign that saw two league squads reach the Final Four.
- **The Big 12 has six teams with winning percentages of .739 or better, the most of any conference in the country. Eleven of 12 squads in the league have win percentages of .565 or higher.**
- The 141 non-conference wins by the Big 12 is a league record for the most in regular-season play. The non-conference winning percentage (.821) would also be a Big 12 record.
- **At least four league teams have been ranked in the top 25 each of the past 10 weeks. Seven conference squads have been in the top 25 at some point this year - the most in one season in Big 12 history.**
- The Big 12 has a .500 or better record against 27 of the 29 conferences its has faced in non-league play this season.



BAYLOR (17-5, 4-4 Big 12)

Next Game: at Nebraska (Feb. 10)

Recent Result: Lost at Texas A&M, 78-71

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/6-4

- Junior guard LaceDarius Dunn had a game-high 23 points at Texas A&M. It was the 10th time this year he has surpassed the 20-point plateau and his 25th career effort over the mark.
- Junior Ekpe Udoh has moved into seventh on the Big 12 single-season blocked shots list (91). He needs just 28 rejections (2.8 per game in his remaining regular season contests) to set the conference record.
- BU leads the Big 12 in rebounding margin (+7.3) and blocked shots (7.3) and is second in field goal percentage (.491) and field goal percentage defense (.372). The Bears have never led the Big 12 in any of the four categories.
- Baylor's win over Iowa State marked its first as a Top 25 team in the month of February since Feb. 15, 1969 (Texas, 63-58).



COLORADO (11-12, 2-7 Big 12)

Next Game: at Kansas State (Feb. 13)

Recent Result: Lost to Missouri, 84-66

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 1-4/3-7

- Freshman guard Alec Burks returned from a knee injury to score a career-high 27 points versus Missouri. The total ranked 10th on CU's freshman single-game scoring list.
- Burks has scored 370 points this year, sixth on the Buffaloes' freshman season scoring chart. He has scored in double digits in all but one game and has led Colorado in scoring nine times.
- Junior guard Cory Higgins has scored in double figures in 22 of 23 outings in 2009-10. He has also connected on 33-of-39 (.846) free throws over his last six contests.
- The Buffs are shooting 76.2 percent (430-of-564) overall from the free throw line, a mark that is first in the league. CU has never led the Big 12 in the category.



IOWA STATE (13-10, 2-6 Big 12)

Next Game: at Missouri (Feb. 10)

Recent Result: Lost to Kansas State, 79-75

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 1-4/3-7

- Junior forward Craig Brackins recorded his 70th career double-digit scoring game with 29 points and 12 rebounds against Kansas State. It was eighth double-double this year.
- Brackins is averaging 25.0 points and 10.7 rebounds over his past three outings. He is shooting 49.1 from the field during that span and has scored 13 points or more in each of his last six contests.
- Junior guard Diante Garrett finished with 10 points, five assists and one turnover versus KSU. He has dished out at least five assists 15 times this year and in 39 career games overall.
- Iowa State has held all but one opponent this season to below 50 percent shooting from the field. The Cyclones have limited 10 foes below the .400 mark from the floor.



KANSAS (23-1, 9-0 Big 12)

Next Game: Iowa State (Feb. 13)

Recent Result: Won at Texas, 80-68

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 5-0/9-1

- Sophomore forward Marcus Morris led KU in scoring for the second straight contest and third time in the last five games with 18 points at Texas. He has scored 13 points or more in every Big 12 game.
- The win at UT was the first for Kansas in Austin since 2002 and was the first for coach Bill Self at Texas. The Jayhawks are 13-5 overall against the Longhorns since the Big 12 began play in 1996-97.
- Senior guard Sherron Collins has scored in double digits in 10 of his past 13 outings. He has 1,704 career points, which ranks 16th on the Big 12 and 10th on the KU all-time scoring charts.
- Kansas has won 55 consecutive home games, the longest active streak in the nation and tied for the second-longest in school history. The school record is 62 in a row from 1993-98.



KANSAS STATE (19-4, 6-3 Big 12)

Next Game: Colorado (Feb. 13)

Recent Result: Won at Iowa State, 79-75

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/7-3

- Senior guard Denis Clemente notched his third career 30-point game, including 18 points from 3-point range, in the win at Iowa State. He has scored 53 points in the last two contests.
- Clemente has made 11-of-17 (.647) shots from 3-point territory over his last two outings. On the season, he has made three or more field goals from beyond the arc nine times.
- After losing its first league road game, Kansas State has won four straight in Big 12 play away from home. The Wildcats are tied (Kansas) for the most conference road victories in the Big 12 this season.
- K-State's 19-point win at Nebraska was its largest margin of victory in a league road game since Big 12 play began in 1996-97. It marked the Wildcats' largest margin in Lincoln since Feb. 3, 1973 (82-55).



MISSOURI (17-6, 5-3 Big 12)

Next Game: Iowa State (Feb. 10)

Recent Result: Won at Colorado, 84-66

Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/7-3

- Sophomore guard Marcus Denmon finished with a career-best 22 points at Colorado. It was his second 20-point effort of the year and the second time in the last three games he has scored in double digits.
- Sophomore guard Kim English has scored 56 points with 15 rebounds in his last three contests. He has nine 20-point performances overall, including two of the past three games.
- Missouri forced the Buffaloes into 16 turnovers. The Tigers have forced opponents into double-figure miscues in every game this season, with foes having 20 or more miscues 17 times.
- Freshman guard Michael Dixon has been perfect from the free throw line in 10 of his last 14 games (he did not attempt a free throw in three of the last 14). He is shooting 84.2 percent from the stripe in 2009-10.



NEBRASKA (13-10, 1-7 Big 12)

Next Game: Baylor (Feb. 10)
Recent Result: Lost at Kansas, 75-64
Last 5/Last 10 Games: 1-4/3-7

- Freshman center Jorge Brian Diaz finished with 20 points and nine rebounds at Kansas. He has 43 points in the last three outings after having 12 total points in his previous three contests.
- Nebraska connected on 10-of-17 (.588) attempts from 3-point range against the Jayhawks. It marked the seventh time in 2009-10 that the Huskers have shot 50 percent or better from beyond the arc.
- Senior guard Ryan Anderson became the 25th player in school history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau. He is the eighth athlete in the Big 12 era to have 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 150 3-pointers.
- Nebraska has held 21 of 23 opponents this year to less than 50 percent shooting from the field. Ten have been below the 40 percent mark, including four of the past eight.



OKLAHOMA (13-9, 4-4 Big 12)

Next Game: Texas Tech (Feb. 9)
Recent Result: Defeated Texas, 80-71
Last 5/Last 10 Games: 2-3/5-5

- Oklahoma won its first game of the season versus a nationally-ranked opponent with the win over Texas. The Sooners improved to 11-0 at home this year and have won 31 of their last 32 in Norman.
- Freshman guard Tommy Mason-Griffin finished with a game-high 24 points against UT. He is averaging 23.6 points over the last five contests and has scored 21 or more in four of those outings.
- Junior guard Cade Davis has scored 57 points in his last three games after combining for 11 in the previous two outings. He had his second career double-double (20 pts, 10 rebs) in the win over the Longhorns.
- In the last three games, Mason-Griffin and Davis have combined to make 23 field goals from 3-point range. As a team, OU is second in the Big 12 with 8.4 per contest from beyond the arc.



OKLAHOMA STATE (16-7, 4-5 Big 12)

Next Game: Oklahoma (Feb. 13)
Recent Result: Lost at Texas Tech, 81-74
Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/6-4

- Sophomore guard Keiton Page scored 20 of his 22 points over an eight-minute span at Texas Tech. It was his third 20-point effort this year after he had combined for five points in his last two games.
- Junior guard James Anderson has scored in double digits in 37 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in OSU history. He has 1,587 career points, the second-best three-year total ever by a Cowboy player (Byron Houston, 1,691).
- Junior forward Marshall Moses has grabbed eight or more rebounds in 17 of 23 outings this season. He is averaging 10.1 boards over his last eight games.
- Junior forward Matt Pilgrim has 22 rebounds in his last two contests and seven boards or more in five of the past eight games.



TEXAS (19-5, 5-4 Big 12)

Next Game: Nebraska (Feb. 13)
Recent Result: Lost to Kansas, 80-68
Last 5/Last 10 Games: 2-3/5-5

- Senior Damion James led Texas with 24 points, 10 rebounds and five blocks against Kansas. It was the 50th double-double of his career and the 13th time this year he has scored 20 points or more.
- Freshman guard J'Covan Brown scored a career-high 28 points versus the Jayhawks with a career-best nine field goals. The total was more than he had posted in the previous five games combined.
- James and fellow senior Justin Mason have played in 132 consecutive games, tied for third on the all-time UT list. The Big 12 record is 138 straight, set by Aaron Miles of Kansas from 2001-05.
- Texas needs one victory to notch its 11th consecutive 20-win campaign. The Longhorns have reached the mark in all but one season under coach Rick Barnes and the current string is a school record.



TEXAS A&M (17-6, 6-3 Big 12)

Next Game: at Texas Tech (Feb. 13)
Recent Result: Defeated Baylor, 78-71
Last 5/Last 10 Games: 4-1/7-3

- Senior forward Bryan Davis scored a season-high 22 points against Baylor. It was his 12th double-figure scoring game of the year.
- Senior guard Donald Sloan has had 20 points or more eight times in 2009-10, including five games in Big 12 play. He has shot 42.9 percent or better from the floor in six of nine league contests.
- The Aggies are 8-3 since starting guard Derrick Roland was injured on Dec. 22. At home, A&M has won 16 consecutive games and is 29-2 since the start of the 2008-09 campaign.
- Texas A&M scored 36 points in the paint versus Baylor and has averaged 40 points in the last three games. The Aggies are 44-4 at home under coach Mark Turgeon when scoring at least 20 points in the paint, including 12-0 this season.



TEXAS TECH (15-7, 3-5 Big 12)

Next Game: at Oklahoma (Feb. 9)
Recent Result: Beat Oklahoma State, 81-74
Last 5/Last 10 Games: 3-2/5-5

- Junior guard John Roberson scored a season-best 28 points in the win over Oklahoma State. It marked the fourth time in the last seven games he has posted 20 points or more.
- Roberson became the Texas Tech all-time leader in assists in the OSU contest. He has dished out 436 in three seasons and needs just 51 more to break into the top 10 of the Big 12 career chart.
- Junior forward Mike Singletary is averaging 20.0 points over his last five games, scoring 20 points or more four times. He also has at least five rebounds in each of those five contests.
- Tech is averaging 81.9 points at home this season and just 71.1 on the road. On defense, the Red Raiders are giving up 70.4 points per game at United Spirit Arena versus 82.0 per game away from Lubbock.
