Steve Denton, Texas A&M Head Coach On the match:

Michael Center, Texas Head Coach

On the match:

"They beat us in the doubles last time, but we got on top today. In these conditions, nothing comes easily. I was really happy with the way we finished that off. John Roddick, Oklahoma Head Coach

On the match:

"I think just sneaking out the doubles point, we almost let that slip. We were in control of it then we ended up having to save match point. I think just coming through that eliminates a little doubt. I think the guys are comfortable playing here and that always helps. It showed in the singles. Our guys weren't doubting themselves at all on any courts really."

On tomorrow's match with Baylor:

They know they can play and have a chance to be in the match, but if we don't play focused and come out and play disciplined tennis, they also know Baylor could run away with it. 
Tim Siegel, Texas Tech Head Coach

On the match:

"After losing the doubles point, our guys were not down, but I thought OU came out early and took it to us. We did everything we could do, they just played better than we did today. Obviously without (Rafael) Garcia in the lineup it changed things for us down low, but you have got to hand it to Oklahoma. It was more about what they did. Steve Denton, Texas A&M Head Coach


"I thought we played well, everyone played well today. "Once again, we couldn't score a point against them at the top. We played well at No. 2 doubles, and I thought we had some chances at No. 1 (doubles), but they just outplayed us. Texas A&M is a very good team. They have great senior leadership, and they are solid all the way through. For us to win against them right now, we've got to take advantage of opportunities, and we didn't do it. I give the Aggies a lot of credit. We've got a lot of work to do to get ready for the NCAA Tournament."

On the match:

On tomorrow's match:



Steve Denton, Texas A&M Head Coach

On satisfaction of winning the Big 12 Championship:

"Our guys played really well this whole tournament. Today the doubles point was key. We got on top of them and our guys won the first set, so they were playing uphill the whole day. They had a really tough match at Baylor and it took a little starch out of their legs. Our match was a little easier and I felt like our guys stayed on top the whole day, and that really was the difference, because OU fought hard. It's great for our program."

On if A&M had the advantage over OU because of championship experience:

"We have some more seniors than they do, so that might have been our advantage to have those guys out there in the key moments. But they've played really well and John (Roddick) has taken that program in two years and he's already beaten Texas and Baylor, and that's a great feat on their part. They've got a great team and we knew we were going to have a battle on our hands today, but our guys were up to the task."

If the team is peaking at the right time:

"I sure hope so, the guys have worked really hard. I felt like last year we peaked a little bit too early. But we've done it a little differently this year and I feel like our guys are fresher and motivated."

John Roddick, Oklahoma Head Coach

On tough loss:

"It was a tough way to go but that's how it goes sometimes. I thought we played pretty well in singles, but A&M has a good team and I think they're realistically the best team in the Big 12 even though they lost here."

On having a great season and making it to the Big 12 Championship game:

"For our program it's a big step, because we've never been to the finals of the tournament. All these new experiences for our guys are going to pay off. We have a really young team, probably the youngest team in the country, so playing these matches is only going to help them. Just being there and having that experience is going to be crucial going forward."

Match notes

Second seed Texas A&M wins its fourth Big 12 Championship title, it's first since 2001 (also 1998 and 2000). Most Outstanding Performer: Jeff Dadamo, Texas A&M. Fifth seed Oklahoma records Big 12 Championship runner-up finish for first time in school history. Oklahoma is lowest seed to ever play in Big 12 Championship final.

Joey Scrivano, Baylor Head Coach On the match:

"Anytime you win easily, bad habits creep in. Oklahoma State definitely forced us to have to play some of our best tennis and that is a positive. When you're in the post-season you want to be playing your best tennis and they definitely pushed us. They're a good team. They've had this kind of season all year where they've pushed really good teams but aren't able to close it out. Thankfully, we came through tonight."

"We knew what we needed to do to win and we knew the doubles point was going to be crucial to give us any chance. Our girls went out with nothing to lose and played a great doubles point. 



On playing Texas tomorrow:


