"Doubles wasn't great, but at the same time I thought even at Court 3 we played pretty well even though we lost there. On Court 2 we can play much better than what we did. Court 1 was great. "That was huge, that doubles match. If we don't have that point, there's still a match out there that could go either way. Getting that point I thought was going to be critical for either team."

Unfortunately sometimes when you learn some things about yourself it doesn't feel good. Today it didn't feel good."
