On the match and the weather:

"I thought we played really well. There was a lot going on outside of just playing, especially with the change of court. We will bounce back and we will be ready."

Matt Knoll, Baylor Head Coach

On the tie-break finish:

"The mistake that you can make is when you start scoreboard watching and paying attention to stuff like that. You've got to get to four points. We got to three relatively quickly but we just couldn't seem to find that fourth one and that's tennis. We've lost a lot of matches. We got to three and you've got to stay focused and keep pushing. I thought TCU really took the momentum there from us for awhile and just really played an exceptional level of tennis."

On the match and tie-break:

"I am obviously disappointed. We were right there and had a match point, but I couldn't be more proud of our guys for the way they fought back. We didn't have the best start possible and it is hard on the road, but we kept fighting and came back in some matches. Nick (Chappell) was down a set and 5-3 in the second and I couldn't be more proud of Nick for coming back in that second set and winning. John Roddick, Oklahoma Head Coach

On what he saw from his team today:

"We have to do a better job of taking opportunities when we have them. In certain spots we had opportunities early that we didn't take advantage of, and then the match ended up getting tough. That's a credit to Texas for playing really well and they are a tough team."

On the championship match...

"I think that was a great match. I think both teams played really well. A lot of credit goes to Baylor, because, as you saw, that match goes either way. That was a coin flip situation and you are not going to see better tennis than down there at (court) six. It was a heck of a match, and I was really proud of our guys for just kind of grinding through that one and pulling it out at the end"

On the dramatic win...

"When you start with singles first it's definitely different, and you kind of don't want to get to the three-all doubles point.
