CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

Seven Big 12 squads made the postseason with four teams in the NCAA Tournament (Baylor, Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Texas), while three participated in the WNIT (K-State, TCU and West Virginia).

Fifty percent of the Big 12 won at least two games in the postseason. Baylor advanced to its 10th consecutive Sweet 16, while Texas made a fourth-straight appearance in the regional semifinal. K-State, TCU and West Virginia each won its first two games in the WNIT. The Horned Frogs and Mountaineers advanced to the WNIT Semifinals.

Seven Big 12 student-athletes earned AP All-America honors. Baylor junior and Big 12 Player of the Year Kalani Brown was named to the AP All-America Second Team. Honorable Mention honorees were: Ariel Atkins (Texas), Bridget Carleton (Iowa State), Loryn Goodwin (Oklahoma State), Kaylee Jensen (Oklahoma State), Brooke McCarty (Texas) and Teana Muldrow (West Virginia).

Baylor's Kalani Brown earned WBCA All-America Team honors, while Ariel Atkins (Texas), Lauren Cox (Baylor), Loryn Goodwin (Oklahoma State) Brooke McCarty (Texas) and Kristy Wallace earned WBCA All-America Honorable Mention.

Four Big 12 women's basketball players were selected in the 2018 WNBA Draft to elevate the Conference's all-time total to 113 in the 22-year history of the professional league. Texas guard Ariel Atkins was picked seventh overall by the Washington Mystics, marking the 35th time a Big 12 player has been selected in the first round. In the second round, guard Kristy Wallace (Baylor) was selected fourth by the Atlanta Dream. Two picks later, Oklahoma State guard Loryn Goodwin was picked sixth by the Dallas Wings. West Virginia forward Teana Muldrow was the fifth pick of the third round by the Seattle Storm.

Marlene Stollings joins the Conference after being named the new head coach at Texas Tech. Stollings comes to Lubbock after four seasons at the University of Minnesota, where she guided the Gophers to an 82-47 (.636) record, three 20-win seasons and three postseason berths, including a second round NCAA appearance this season. Stollings' squad reached the NCAA Tournament in 2018 for the second time in four years and the 10th time in program history.

Baylor took home three individual awards to highlight the 2017-18 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 Women's Basketball Awards. Kim Mulkey was named the Coach of the Year for the sixth time since 2005, after guiding her team to an undefeated conference season. Junior center Kalani Brown was

selected as Player of the Year, while sophomore forward Lauren Cox was tabbed as Defensive Player of the Year.

Loryn Goodwin (Oklahoma State) earned Newcomer of the Year honors, while Amy Okonkwo (TCU) earned the Sixth Man Award. Shaina Pellington (Oklahoma) was named the 2018 Big 12 Freshman of the Year. For a full slate of award winners see list on page four.

Baylor became the fifth team to finish the Big 12 regular season undefeated to claim its eighth consecutive regular-season title. BU previously went undefeated in league play in 2011-12 and 2012-13. The Lady Bears won their ninth Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship postseason crown with a 77-69 win over No. 2 seed Texas. Kalani Brown was named the Most Outstanding Player, while Lauren Cox and Alexis Morris also earned All-Tournament Team recognition. Texas' Ariel Atkins and Brooke McCarty were also named to the All-Tournament Team.

The Big 12 split the 2017 Big 12/SEC Challenge with a 5-5 mark. However, the Big 12 won both of its top 25 matchups as then-ranked No. 9/9 Baylor toppled No. 20/22 Kentucky, 90-63, and No. 11/12 West Virginia collected a 70-56 win at No. 18/21 Texas A&M.

Baylor and Texas finished No. 9 and No. 10, respectively, in the final 2018 USA TODAY Sports Coaches' poll. In the AP poll, the Lady Bears were ranked No. 2 and the Longhorns No. 8.

All 10 Big 12 programs finished with a strength of schedule of 80 or better. Oklahoma had the nation's second-toughest schedule followed by No. 17 Texas and No. 23 Baylor.

Seventy percent of Big 12 teams ranked in the top-100 of RPI: No. 4 Baylor, No. 12 Texas, No. 35 Oklahoma, No. 57 Oklahoma State, No. 64 West Virginia, No. 69 TCU and No. 89 K-State.

The Big 12 was the only autonomy conference where 90 percent of teams have won at least one game against a Top 25 opponent.

The Big 12 led the nation in scoring offense with 73.2 points per game. Three Big 12 teams were in the top-21 in scoring offense: No. 2 Baylor (86.1), No. 14 Texas (80.7) and No. 21 Oklahoma State (78.3).
