Kansas State Head Coach Steve Bietau

"Our No. 1 doubles team has been playing well and that took care of that. It's definitely easier when you only have to get two points in singles to clinch the match. We were a little bit up and a little bit down and just had to get through it.

"Tough match ahead. We've been competitive with Texas Tech, but we've got to find a way to get two more points."

West Virginia Head Coach Tina Samara

"We played this team four days ago, so our result was we split on 4, we split on 1, had a much more competitive match at 3. That's all you can ask as a coach, is to do better the next time. The doubles, I was disappointed with. Our No. 2 team was hanging in there. They were down 5-2, but the games were close. Our No. 1s just didn't show up which hurts you when you need to win both.

"We have a lot of work to do. I've coached in the Big 12 before so it doesn't matter what I knew, they needed to see it to understand. I'm pretty sure they do. If this doesn't make them believe, I don't know what will."
